

### 3.0 CORRECTIONS TO THE DEIS

During the preparation of the FEIS, a small number of errors were identified within the DEIS. Corrections to these errors are described below.

- DEIS Table 3 indicates that an Article 24 Permit from the NYSDEC will be required for disturbance to state jurisdictional wetlands. The table should indicate that the Article 24 Permit is also required for disturbance to the 100-foot adjacent areas. [For additional detail regarding anticipated jurisdiction, please see Section 4.3 of this FEIS.]
- With respect to the VIA (DEIS Appendix K):
  - Page 13 indicates that St. Bonaventure University is located in the City of Olean. It is actually located in the Town of Allegany.
  - Page 28 erroneously indicates that Salamanca is a village. While this passage in the VIA was referring to the City of Salamanca, there is also a Town of Salamanca.
  - Figure 10 did not indicate the location of the inset box depicting sensitive sites within the City of Olean. A revised Figure 10 is presented in FEIS Appendix E.
  - The location of a property recently listed on the National Register of Historic Places at 520 Hoe-Sta-Geh Road in Allegany has been added to revised VIA Figure 6 in FEIS Appendix E, and balloon locations have been added to the VIA viewpoint location map (see revised Figure 10 in FEIS Appendix E).
- A commenter pointed out that the list of parks in the City of Olean included in Section 3.11 of the DEIS “Community Facilities and Services” (Page 205) omits a small park at south side of Veteran’s Memorial Bridge over Allegany River, at the corner of Riverside Drive and York Street. This park contains a Veteran’s Memorial and memorial plaque to George Washington. The Project will not affect this park.
- A commenter pointed out that Section 3.11 of the DEIS omits a discussion of the Chipmonk Community Center, a local resource that is located on Chipmonk Road. The Chipmonk Community Center is a private facility owned by St. Bonaventure Church. The center is primarily used for church functions, and is occasionally rented out for graduation/birthday parties. The Project will not affect this community center.

- Sections 3.12.2.2.7 and 3.12.3.2.7 of the DEIS incorrectly state that OE/AAA aeronautical studies are underway. As correctly indicated in Section 3.12.1.7 of the DEIS, “*The objective of Title 14 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Part 77, is to promote air safety and the efficient use of the navigable airspace. To meet this objective, the FAA conducts obstruction evaluation/airport airspace analysis (OE/AAA) aeronautical studies based on parameters of the proposed project, such as wind turbine locations, maximum height above ground level (agl), and wind turbine lighting and color. For the proposed Allegany Wind Power Project, a Notice of Proposed Construction or Alteration (Form 7460-1) was filed on-line with the FAA, and accepted for study on November 24, 2009. FAA determinations were subsequently issued on January 24, 2010, and all turbines are classified as “No Hazard” (see Appendix S).*”
- Appendix S of the DEIS erroneously contained duplicate copies of FAA determinations. Individual determinations for each turbine, as issued by the FAA on January 24, 2010, are provided in FEIS Appendix F. In summary, a total of only 14 turbines (48%) will be equipped with night lights per FAA requirements (see Figure 1 of this FEIS).
